### III.F. Professional and Extension Education

#### III.F.1. Professional Programs Established

- 1) Familias Activas/Active Families (Leader) is a federally funded (CYFAR-USDA) community-based participatory research project that aims to strengthen youth mental health and lower youth anxiety amongst Latino youth (ages 10-14) by engaging families in a multi-component program including: 1) Culturally and linguistically appropriate family life education. 2) Positive Youth Development programming (PYD) focusing on mental health, and 3) Youth physical activity sessions (soccer practices). The program is being developed in partnership with Latino community-based family organizations in Maryland and aims to build on the strengths of immigrant Latino families.
  
- 2) Padres Positivos, Jóvenes Saludables (Leader) is a 6-session family-based intervention in rural Honduras to strengthen youth mental health and paternal parenting practices. UMD researchers collaborated with the Organization for Community Health Outreach (OCHO) to develop, pilot, and evaluate this program in San Vicente, Honduras. A total of six sessions and one booster session were delivered in-person in 2022. The adapted program relied on the Padres Preparados curriculum, ensuring its cultural appropriateness and relevance to the audience. The adapted program topics included: (1) positive parenting practices, (2) communication, (3) adolescent development, (4) human sexuality, (5) anatomy and reproductive health, and (6) gender identity. A train-the-trainer program is underdevelopment.

- 3) Padres Preparados, Jóvenes Saludables (Leader) is an 8-session family-skills intervention for Latino fathers and youth (10-14 years) to improve youth energy balance-related behaviors, and paternal parenting practices with the goal of obesity prevention. A total of 5 sessions were provided in-person and 3 through a mobile application (mHealth app). The development of the app used participative principles with feedback from a parent advisory board, participants, educators, and multimedia experts. The App content follows an active learning cycle, including didactic (using videos), reflection, skill building, family plan, and follow-up text messages.
- 4) Padre Preparados, Jóvenes Saludables: A blended intervention approach to address obesity in Latino families (Leader). The well-being of Latino children and adolescents is challenged by overweight and obesity. Parents are key players in shaping the physical and social/emotional environments that guide eating and exercise behaviors and consequently their children's weight status. Common behavioral prevention programs include information regarding lifestyle-health relationships and skills around healthy eating and physical activity. However, most programs reach mothers, so there are no programs reaching fathers, especially Latino Immigrant fathers.
- 5) Identity Parent Academy-Academia de Liderazgo (Program Developer). Parent-school engagement programs are effective; however, few focus on parent leadership and advocacy capacities to address policy and systems issues. This program aims to strengthen the leadership and advocacy skills of Latino parents of school age youth in Montgomery County, MD. The program included nine sessions in Spanish, following an experiential learning cycle (discussion, lecture, role playing, small-group work, individual reflections, and skill-building).
- 6) Educación Nuestra Mejor Herencia/Education Our Best Legacy (Program Developer). Education: Our Best Legacy (EOBL) is a school success program. It is intended to be delivered to parents or caregivers with one or more children in middle school. This psychosocial family-based intervention includes seven sessions for parents/caregivers for Latino immigrant families.
