Peace Corps Prep Program: *Developed and wrote proposal*. MOA was signed in *June 2021 for the University of Maryland to offer a Peace Corps Prep Certificate* to all interested undergraduate students. *Established a campus wide advisory group* to inform program processes.

II.B.2. Course or Curriculum Development

Partnership with Montgomery College Introduction to Community Health Course and HLTH 490: Professional Preparation in Community Health (2022). Working with faculty at Montgomery College (MC) we transformed two key assignments in each of our classes to allow students at MC to research a local health problem and deliver a problem statement to HLTH 490 students for use in developing a solution to the problem and writing a grant. MC faculty choose the health issue and funder while HLTH 490 faculty guide students through the grant writing process. All proposals are delivered to MC for use in applying.

Implemented New HLTH Program Competency (2020) to reflect learning and attitudinal changes regarding anti-racism through *leading sessions with core instructors using backward-design to create learning objectives and course content* that teaches about racism/anti-racism and its impact (historically and present) on public health in relation to theory, research, practice, professionalism, and health outcomes.

Established a program level competency (2020) to reflect professionalism as a fundamental component of the undergraduate Community Health program after *leading* the department faculty through curriculum mapping activities.

Redesigned HLTH 471: Women's Health (2018) into an *online format using* backwards design in collaboration with Dr. Sue Reynolds. Together, we developed a selfpaced approach to the modules to increase student interest and engagement.

Redesigned HLTH 490: Professional Preparation in Community Health (2019 & 2021) into a *flipped course*. All lectures were developed and recorded to be presented online. *Class lesson plans were re-structured to be activity/discussion based* and provided *time in class for group project planning/writing*. In 2021, *received a grant* from the Teaching and Learning Transformation Center *to apply Universal Design for Learning*

principles to the course including captioning all videos, writing transcripts for all assignments, and providing multiple methods of engagement.

Redesigned HLTH 391: Making a Difference, Applying Community Health & HLTH 302: Methods of Community Assessment (2019) to ensure appropriate scaffolding of course content and reduce redundancy. In collaboration with course instructors, we developed course content that would enable students to engage a community research partners including data management and analysis, walking tours, GIS mapping, direct observation, individual interviewing, photovoice, and evidence-based assessment of existing interventions.
